

### The capability approach

Capability (Amartya Sen) as the "real freedom to lead a life one has reason to value"



2 complementary axes for empirical investigation:

- Real freedom vs. formal freedom: resources, individual and social conversion factors
- Freedom to choose and reason to value

## **Public Policies against Capabilities**

### **Resources:**

- Are there gaps? Are they adequate (sufficient or, maybe, too high)?
- Effective access and non-take up

### **Conversion factors:**

- Individual: multidimensionality, individual aspirations/capacities and institutional expectations (risk of selectivity)
- Contextual: Social norms and opportunities, adequacy of environment (material and symbolic barriers)

### Freedom to choose:

 Opportunities to participate in the design and implementation of public policies (judicial / political)
